SCRATCHES/ADDS DEADLINE: Monday, April 13th at 5:00 PM


All changes and scratches must be emailed to tbuchanan@mpisd.net and jlitke@mpisd.net. It is the responsibility of the coach making the changes or scratches to also notify their district meet director and the alternate competitor's coach who will be replacing your athlete of those changes. Please cc all parties that are involved in the change/scratches. Changes over the phone will not be accepted. This is done to ensure accuracy for each district and so each district and the meet officials will have a record of changes made.

ADMISSION:

Contestants, Coaches, and Officials will be admitted with wristbands.
All Others: Adults - \$10, Students - \$5

SPECTATOR PARKING: Will be on the West side of the stadium behind the home stands.  (Refer to Map)

BUS PARKING:

Will be on the High School Campus behind the visitors stands and in the parking lot between the softball and baseball fields (refer to map). All other vehicles will need to park behind the home side stands. 

CONCESSIONS:

Concession stand will be located on the Home side of the stadium.

MEDICAL: Mount Pleasant High School will provide two (2) Athletic Trainers. There will be one athletic trainer set up near the finish line at all times, and the other AT will be monitoring field events. There will be several water cows located in the stadium at all times. If your athlete needs special treatment before or after an event, please contact Alex Fellows, Head Athletic Trainer afellows@mpisd.net

SPECTATORS: Designated viewing areas will be established at each field event for fans. Only athletes that are competing during the current session will be allowed in the jumping or throwing areas. Spectators will not be allowed in the roped off areas. Coaches will have access to all areas during warmups. Once the competition begins, coaches will move to designated coaches' boxes.

WARM-UPS: Stadium will be closed for warmups starting at 3:30PM. The warmup area will be the grass field North of the stadium at the Junior High. Refer to the map below on how to access the warmup area.

TEAM CAMPS: Visitor side stands.

AWARDS: All awards will be presented at the conclusion of the event at the awards stand at mid-field. The top 4 will report to the awards stand as soon as possible for the announcement of the medalists and qualifiers to the regional meet.

OTHER REMINDERS:

- Uniforms – School Issued Only – According to UIL Regulations
 - Removing any part of a uniform in competition area is prohibited (1st infraction – warning, 2nd –event DQ)
- Protests must be filed with the meet referee within 30 minutes of the results becoming final
 - Meet referee will rule on protests and will have the final decision
 - The following can be protested:
 - Misapplication of the rules
 - Correction of clerical or team scoring errors (deadline is 48 hours from the end of the meet)
 - Correction of meet results involving an ineligible participant
 - Failure to follow a procedure established by the meet director in the meet packet
 - The following cannot be protested:
 - Judgement calls by officials (baton out of the zone, foot fouls in field events, etc.)
 - Whether a start was fair and legal
 - Decisions made by finish judges/timers

Important Information Regarding Field Events, Running Events, and Meet Workers

Shot Put & Discus: All implements will be weighed, measured and marked before competition. Implements will be stored and transported to the venue when weigh-in closes. Any implements that are illegal will be impounded and secured until the end of competition. Weigh-in will open at 7:00 AM and will close *promptly* at 8:30 AM. Athletes will take their throws in order during each round of competition. (Two attempts in succession will not be permitted). Seeding in descending order determined by the best mark recorded in their respective district meet with 3 throws. Reverse order in finals (8th-1st) determined from the first round of competition and 3 more attempts in finals. Competitors must have at least one successful attempt with a legal mark in the preliminary rounds to advance to finals. Ties will be broken by using the next best attempt out of all attempts in preliminaries and finals.

Vertical Jumps: Athletes can weigh-in and certify pole vault poles in the fieldhouse from 7:00 AM to 8:30 AM. Seeding in descending order determined by the best mark recorded in their respective district meet. In the case of a tie (high jump and pole vault) from 1st-8th, there will be a jump off at the end of the competition. If there are multiple ties, the highest tie will have the jump off first, followed by the next highest tie until all ties are broken.

Horizontal Jumps: Athletes will take their jumps in order during each round of competition (Two attempts in succession will not be permitted). Seeding in descending order determined by the best mark recorded in their respective district meet with 3 jumps in the first round. Reverse order in finals (8th – 1st), determined from the first round of competition, and 3 more attempts in finals. Competitors must have at least one successful attempt with a legal mark in prelims to advance to finals. Ties will be broken by using the next best attempt out of all attempts in prelims and finals.

Lane Assignments: Running events will be seeded by place from their respective district meet results with the faster runner drawing the inside lane.

Relay Cards: Relay cards will be due at 3:00 PM. Turn-in location will be at the heating table located by the staging area.

Judges: Each school will need to provide two **adult** field event workers **and** one exchange/lane judge for the running events.

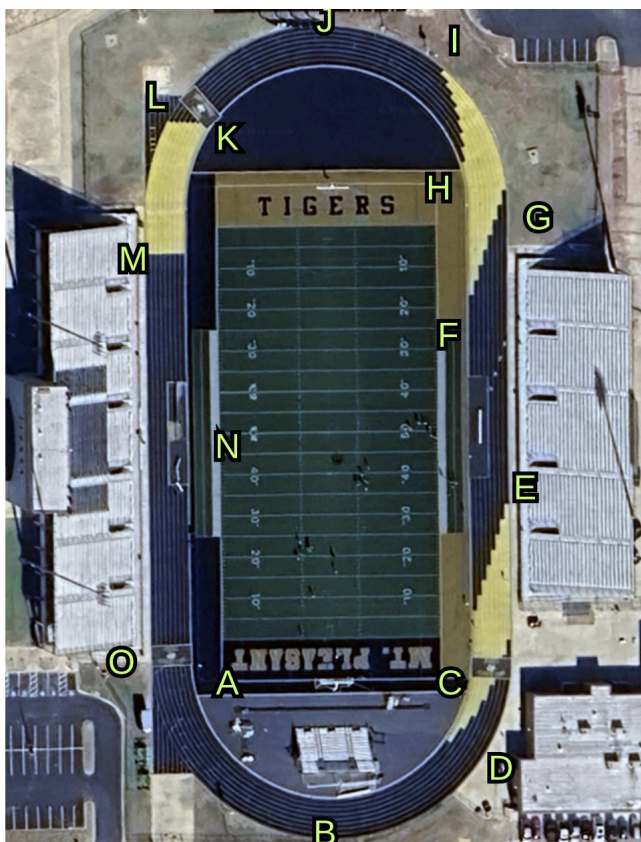
